#### ADVOCACY UPDATE

#### James reported....

- WAEA Position Statements: James is currently drafting position statements for the following items:
  - -VAPA requirements and cross-credited CTE courses
  - -WAEA's support of the specialist model for the teaching of visual art in the elementary schools
  - -WAEA's support for only allowing qualified, certificated teachers, with an actual visual art endorsement, to teach visual art, at any level, in Washington public schools.
- o **CORE24 VAPA credits:** James reported he still waiting on word on whether or not any action will be taken, this year, to change the second VAPA credit to 'required' instead of waivable
- o **License plates:** James would like direction from the board on whether or not. As he wants to know should he look further into establishing Visual Art vanity plates, the way the MAEA has.
- Seattle Advocacy Event: James is working with Kate Baker to set up an evening advocacy event focused on the Seattle SD art teachers. Ideally, this will happen before the current school year is out.
- WAEA PAC: James has started researching what would be involved in starting a WAEA PAC. James suggested shooting for a \$5/month contribution from WAEA PAC members which, if we could get full participation, would give us close to \$20K a year.

### Faye Scannell reported on...

o King County Arts Advocacy Meeting Minutes Friday, April 28, 2017

**Legislative Update:** A special session began on Monday and will run for 30 days. It is assumed that there will be a second special session because of the differences between the House and the Senate on funding a solution for the McCleary decision. The ArtsWA budget has been restored and the public art portal has been restored.

- Access for All: Jim Kelly reported that there are four King County council members who would vote
  for placing Access for All on the August 17 ballot. The King County Council will meet to determine if
  Access for All will be taken out of committee and brought up for a vote by the entire council.
- WSAA Planning: A new model is to partner with other organizations on other advocacy issues that
  involve the arts, such as affordable housing and homelessness, health and mental health, education,
  and transportation. The creative advantage program and education would be two areas to
  emphasize. ArtsWA could provide letters that grant recipients send to legislators for use as
  testimonials to elected officials.
